I am among the few luckiest alumni who have had the opportunity to stay in Jaipur throughout my life at SMS Medical College I Started as Assistant Professor, became Professor at the early age of 38 years, and Professor and Head at 44. At the time of retirement I was additional Principal SMS and Chairman Board of Studies at Rajasthan University of Health Sciences There were two tragedies in my life Once one of my friends injected cortisone in my knee for the relief of knee pain and it resulted in painful swelling of my knee which persisted for almost three months and that pain is persisting till today for which I am doing knee exercises daily Once in my annual health check-up in the Manipal Hospital, our pathologist came running to me informing me about platelets count of 9.5 lacks. I had to under go a bone marrow biopsy and was diagnosed idiopathic thrombocytosis, for which I, later on, consulted a senior hematologist in Mumbai and was finally diagnosed with Polycythemia Vera for which I am taking drugs till today.
